BAY RIVER RUMBLE PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Players will always conduct themselves in a respectful manner towards their coaching staff, fellow teammates, league officials, and opponents. A positive image and good example will be expected at every practice, game, and function.

Players will work to maintain good academic performance. In the event that a player's grades fall below a 2.0, she is expected to inform the Manager or Coach and request assistance. The Manager will attempt to find an organization member who is willing to offer tutoring.

Players are expected to get to practice, games, and team functions on time. If a player has a conflict, will arrive late, or need to leave early, she must notify the Manager as early as possible.

Players are not permitted to use offensive language.

Players are not permitted to engage in any physical altercations. Such behavior may be grounds for immediate dismissal from the team.

Players are responsible for their own personal equipment. Ensure that you bring all necessary equipment and pack it up at the end of the practice/game. Players are expected to carry their own gear.

Players are expected to clean up. This includes trash, empty bottles, and helping with team equipment.

Players can expect to be treated fairly by the coaching staff.

Players are expected to communicate any problems or concerns to their Manager or Coach. This is a great time to learn how to speak on your own behalf in a respectful and productive manner.

Players are expected to give 100% at each practice and game. Slacking off, horseplay, and general lack of interest will not be tolerated.

Players are expected to listen to their coaches without interruption.

Players shall notify the Coach if she has an injury or illness that may require consideration during practice/game.

Players can expect that Rumble will not impact their play on school or recreational softball teams. Players will not be asked to choose between the two. The expected commitment should be:

school team, recreational team (little league), and then Rumble. However, exceptions may be requested for specific tournaments and should be discussed with the Manager on a case-by-case basis. Participation in other travel ball organizations is not permitted without the Manager's approval.

Players can expect support in regards to other school and athletic activities. However, it is the player's responsibility to discuss these commitments in advance with the Manager.

Players shall conduct themselves as ladies and follow all field/complex rules.

Players shall cheer for their team, not against the opponent.

Players may not leave the dugout without the Coach's permission. Such requests should be reserved for bathroom breaks and emergencies. Players' attention should always be on the game and their teammates.
